



But God judges through them, they are judges and are part: Revelation 6:4 And I saw thrones, and they sat on them to whom judgment was committed, and I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded for their testimony about Jesus and for the word of God, who had not worshiped the beast or its image, and who had not received its mark on their foreheads or on their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years (and forever).

Hosea 6:2 After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, and we will live before him. (I believe that Christ is reincarnated in the third millennium to be seated at the right hand of God: Psalm 90:4 For a thousand years in your sight Are like yesterday that passed, And like one watch in the night.)
